Structural Behaviorology is based on the assumption that structure fundamentally shapes the behavior of the body and space rather than merely serving as a load-bearer. It aims to reshape our understanding of force, gravity, and equilibrium by reintroducing our bodily experiences into structural thinking. Therefore, this workshop starts with reexamining daily objects. We observe, analyze, and collect those unspectacular of everyday life, not only household utensils, electrical appliances, and furniture in the domestic setting, but also the double meter, ladder, and shovel from our working environment. These items are delivered to this corridor that we often pass by quickly without

noticing. In dialogue with the existing structure, we attempt to build an installation that activates the space by redirecting the flow of air, sight, body, and emotion.

On the 16th of September, we invite you to explore the structure built by students. At the installation, students will explain their ideas and the process leading up to the final installation and they will present research and drawings analysing the final structure with each of our topics.
